

One war fought by the United States in the 1900s was World War II.


The United States fought in World War II from 1941 – 1945.


The United States fought Japan, Germany, and Italy in World War II.

Germany and Italy are countries in Europe on the other side of the Atlantic Ocean.


He served as President of the United States from 1933 – 1945. Franklin Delano Roosevelt died in 1945 while serving as president before World War II ended.
